She becomes his spying accomplice by revealing secret scientific rocket developmental information to the British Secret Intelligence Service in London. Things become tense when Gertrud and Alfred are discovered and arrested by the German secret police. Alfred is deported to the Mauthausen (Vernichtungslager) Extermination Camp while Gertrud is interned to Dachau concentration camp.
